



# U.S. ARMY ADJUTANT GENERAL SCHOOL FORT JACKSON, SOUTH CAROLINA



## **COLONEL(Ret) MICHAEL R. MOLOSSO** **Deputy Commandant**

Colonel Michael R. Molosso was born June 7, 1953 in Hammonton, NJ, and graduated from Valley Forge Military Academy, Wayne, PA in May 1971. He earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Government from Seton Hall University in South Orange, NJ in May 1975 and was commissioned in the Regular Army in June 1975.

Colonel Molosso's previous assignments include Germany where he served as a Forward Observer for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 6<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery Regiment, Geinhausen, and later as an Administrative Officer in the Frankfurt Military community. In 1979, he served as Adjutant and Operations Officer of the Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station, Raleigh, NC. He completed the Adjutant General Advanced Course in June 1982, and was assigned to Fort Bragg, NC, as the 82<sup>nd</sup> Adjutant General Company Commander and then as the Chief of Personnel Management Branch in the Office of the 82<sup>nd</sup> AG. In February 1985, he was reassigned to Fort McPherson, GA, serving as an Action Officer and Team Chief on the DCSPER's Army of Excellence Task Force.

After completing CGSC in June 1988, Colonel Molosso was assigned to Camp Casey, Korea, 8<sup>th</sup> Personnel Command and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division as the Commander, 509<sup>th</sup> Personnel Service Company. He returned to Fort Bragg in July 1989 as the Deputy Adjutant General and later as the Division G1/AG. He assumed command of the Baltimore Military Entrance Processing Station in July 1992. He entered the United States Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, PA, in July 1994 and upon graduation, he was assigned to the Army Staff in the Office of the DCSPER, Washington, D.C., as a Branch Chief in Officer Division and then as the Officer Division Chief. From August 1998 to August 2000, he served as Commander, Eastern Sector, USMEPCOM in North Chicago, IL.

His awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal with one oak leaf cluster, Meritorious Service Medal, with three oak leaf clusters, Army Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal with two Bronze Service Stars, Saudi Arabian Kuwait Liberation Medal, Kuwait Liberation Medal, Overseas Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, the Senior Parachutist's Badge and the Army Staff Identification Badge.
