Mr. Ward Ward has served as the Deputy Commandant of the Adjutant General School (AGS) from October 2018 to present. He is a retired AG officer with over 35 years' experience in Army Human Resources (HR) Management. Prior to his current position, Mr. Ward was the Integrated Personnel and Pay System – Army (IPPS-A) task lead and Training Development and HR subject matter expert for the AGS. He led the effort to place HR system training (eMILPO, DTAS, EDAS, TOPMIS, iPERMS) into all HR courses.

Mr. Ward is Senior Professional in Human Resource (SPHR) and Project Management Professional (PMP) certified, holds Master's Degrees in Human Resources Management and Leadership and Management, and graduated the Senior Human Resource Management Course and Army Command Staff Course (Resident). He retired from the Army in 2004. His military assignments included I Corps G1, 3rd and 24th Infantry Division G1, First Personnel Group, Brigade S1, and assignments with Joint Special Operations Command (JSOC), Human Resources Command (HRC), Military Entrance Processing Command (MEPCOM), and AGS. His civilian jobs have included DA Staff (Army G1), S1NET Facilitator, AGS instructor and training developer, and Training Director for a private IT company. Mr. Ward served on the Army G1 development team that conceived, designed, tested, and fielded the Personnel Service Delivery Redesign (PSDR) concept.

Mr. Ward previously served on the AG Corps Regimental Association (AGCRA) National Executive Council (NEC), multiple AGCRA Chapters, and the Fort Jackson Retiree Council.
